Resources washed each night or at the end of each session if possible, Sessions planned so resources are individual and not shared. <u>Vulnerable staff and clients</u>	
Those who are clinically extremely	
vulnerable (those who have received a

Providing first aid requires that social distancing rule to be broken. This could lead to either person involved in becoming infected with COVID-19 through close contact with an asymptomatic carrier, transmitting the virus through bodily fluids or respiratory droplets entering the persons eyes, nose or mouth.

The First aider may have an allergic reaction to latex gloves.

A first aider will NOT be treating a person who has the symptoms of COVID-19 as specified by the NHS and Government unless life threatening condition use St John's ambulance guidance.

If a client presents symptoms of COVID-19 they will be isolated ideally in a separate room or where this is not possible 2m away from people and someone called to collect them.

The first aider will wash their hands for at least 20 seconds with liquid soap and water.

The first aider will cover any cuts on their hands with waterproof plasters.

The first aider will avoid putting their

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fingers in their mouth and touching their face. The first aider will avoid touching any part of a dressing that will come in contact with a wound After each first aid treatment is given all equipment and surfaces, including goggles used will be cleaned down After using the face masks, aprons and gloves they will be correctly doffed and placed straight into the waste bags and Bio Waste bins that are provided Face masks and gloves will only be used for 1 treatment of first aid they will not be used to treat a second person requiring first aid. First aiders have been given information on how to correctly don and doff their PPE.

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
